# Local Church & Community involvement

\* Now aged 64, I was a High School Physics Teacher before I retired. I tutor Physics students part-time.

\* Before my 12 years teaching Science, I was an Engineer in the Cable-making industry for 20+ years.

\* I saw rapid technology change from the start of the fibre optics revolution which enabled today's internet.

\* I worked to harmonise technical standards within the industry. Not exactly General Synod! But it *did* involve close listening and working to achieve good relationships with people from different nationalities.

## Early Life, Family and Current interests

\* Born in Uganda, when I was aged 16 our family had to return to the UK because of Idi Amin. I witnessed the reconciling power of Jesus, both between tribes and between black and white. My godfather was the first African Archbishop of the Anglican Church of Uganda. His successor Janani Luwum was martyred.

\* I helped care for my godly mum as dementia gradually took hold. She died in 2015 aged 97.

\* I sing second tenor with Haydock Male Voice Choir.

\* Passionate about Christian apologetics, especially the many recent scientific discoveries revealing God's 'eternal power and divine nature' (Romans 1:20)

### What I believe I can bring to General Synod

\* I will seek to represent all the laity and, if elected, I will commit to being available to electors and to providing feedback.

Two particular issues where I can contribute: \* 1. Facing up to the massive urgency of Climate Change. My technical background, plus experience with low-carbon heat, power, and transport.

\* 2. Jesus gave us a main task, to make disciples. How can we in the Church of England sustain our focus on this main task, rather than constantly being distracted by other issues such as our beautiful buildings?
