## ***The Baptism of Mia Jung***

### **The Presentation of the Candidate**

*Father Steven addresses the whole congregation*

Faith is the gift of God to his people.  
In baptism the Lord is adding to our number  
those whom he is calling.  
People of God, will you welcome this child  
and uphold her in her new life in Christ?

**All: With the help of God, we will.**

*Father Steven then says to the parents and godparents*

Parents and godparents, the Church receives this child with joy.  
Today we are trusting God for her growth in faith.  
Will you pray for her, draw her by your example into the  
community of faith and walk with her in the way of Christ?  
**With the help of God, we will.**

In baptism this child begins her journey of faith.  
You speak for her today.  
Will you care for her, and help her to take her place  
within the life and worship of Christ's Church?  
**With the help of God, we will.**

### **The Decision**

*Father Steven addresses the parents and godparents*

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.  
To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.  
Therefore I ask:  
Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?  
**I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?  
**I renounce them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us  
from God and neighbour?

**I repent of them.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

**I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

**I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

**I come to Christ.**

## **The Signing with the Cross**

*Father Steven makes the sign of the cross on the candidate's forehead, saying*

Christ claims you for his own.

Receive the sign of the cross.

*Father Steven invites the parents and godparents to make the sign of the cross.*

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

**All: Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ  
against sin, the world and the devil,  
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,  
restore in you the image of his glory,  
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

**All: Amen.**

*Father Steven, the godparents, parents and candidate move to the Font.*

*All who are able are encouraged to come and join us forming a large semi-circle  
around the font. The Choir sing "Spirit of the Living God" by Daniel Iverson.*

## The Prayer over the Water

*Father Steven stands before the water of baptism and says*

Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
**All: who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**All: It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain,  
refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.  
Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt  
to freedom in the Promised Land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John  
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,  
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.

In it we are buried with Christ in his death.

By it we share in his resurrection.

Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptize  
into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit,  
they may be cleansed from sin and born again.

Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith  
and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;  
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory,  
now and for ever.

**All: Amen**

## The Profession of Faith

*Father Steven addresses **the whole congregation:***

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess  
together the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

**All: I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

**All: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

**All: I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

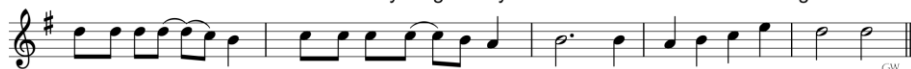
