If you intend to put your name forward for election to the PCC or as a Churchwarden, please note that you will need to sign a 'PCC Member Trustee Eligibility' declaration and an 'HMRC Fit and Proper Persons' declaration.

These two declarations are available at the back of church. They are on one sheet.

In addition, all PCC members are required to take the Church of England Basic and Foundation safeguarding training courses, available online, on election and renewable every three years. As charity trustees, you will also need to apply for an enhanced DBS. If you have any queries, please let me know.
