We are delighted to share that Bishop Ruth is returning to our diocese in February, following her secondment to the Diocese of Coventry. A welcome service will be held on Sunday 2 February at the 3pm Candlemas Eucharist at Wells Cathedral. Everyone is warmly invited to attend.



Energy Footprint Tool now open for 2025

The Church of England's <u>Energy Footprint Tool</u> (EFT) is now open for churches to enter energy use from 2024. Last year an incredible 60% of churches in Bath and Wells took part. This year we are hoping to get as close to a 100% as possible.

The data collected will help your church understand its carbon footprint and will mean you may be eligible for grants to help kickstart your net zero projects. The EFT calculates the carbon footprint by analysing energy consumption and sources. This is crucial for identifying opportunities to cut costs, reduce emissions, and take meaningful steps toward sustainability.

You can find the Energy Footprint Tool on the <u>Online Parish Returns System</u>. Completing it is straightforward. You'll need your 2024 energy bills, details about your energy suppliers, and a rough idea of your church's usage. Once you have this information, the process takes about 15 minutes. Share your views on Safeguarding

A reminder that in March, it will be the turn of Bath and Wells to be audited by the INEQE Safeguarding Group. The audit is part of a national programme, commissioned by the Archbishop's Council, to conduct an intensive and comprehensive review of safeguarding at each diocese and cathedral in the Church of England.

People holding different roles across the diocese, including clergy, church volunteers and worshippers are invited to complete a safeguarding survey for the INEQE audit. Find out more about the survey.

Racial Justice Sunday - 2 February 2025

Racial Justice Sunday was established 30 years ago, in response to the murder of Black teenager Stephen Lawrence two years earlier.

This year's theme, 'Coat of Many Colours', is designed to help us reflect on the increasing diversity that exists in the churches in Britain and Ireland. It offers an opportunity for all Christians to join together in:

- Reflecting on the importance of racial justice
- Thanksgiving for human diversity
- Prayer for an end to misunderstanding, racism and injustice
- · Action that truly makes a difference
- Fundraising for national and local racial justice initiatives
