

## BUDDHIST FESTIVAL OF VESAK

Vesak, is the celebration of Buddha's birth. It is remembered on the first full moon in May. Although Buddhist festivals have centuries-old traditions, the first conference of the World Fellowship of Buddhists, held in Sri Lanka in 1950, formalised the decision to celebrate Vesak as the Buddha's birthday across many Buddhist countries.

In Theravada countries, it is the most important day in the Buddhist calendar. During Vesak, Buddhists celebrate the life of the Buddha and his teachings. They remember the time of his enlightenment and the celebration can last for up to three days. On Vesak, devout Buddhists and followers assemble in their various temples before dawn for the ceremonial hoisting of the Buddhist flag and the singing of hymns in praise of the holy triple gem; The Buddha, The Dharma (his teachings) and The Sangha (his disciples). Devotees also bring offerings of flowers, candles and joss-sticks to lay at the feet of their teacher. These symbolic offerings are to remind followers that just as the beautiful flowers would wither away after a short while, and the candles and joss-sticks would soon burn out, so too is life subject to decay and destruction. Devotees are enjoined to make a special effort to refrain from killing of any kind and are encouraged to eat only vegetarian food for the day. In some countries, notably Sri Lanka, two days are set aside for the celebration of Vesak, and all shops selling alcohol, and any slaughter houses, are closed by government decree during the two days. Also, birds, insects and animals are released in what is known as life release, to give freedom to those who are in captivity, imprisoned or tortured against their will.



Devout Buddhists undertake to lead a noble life according to the teaching by making daily affirmations to observe the Five Precepts. However, on special days, notably new moon and full moon days, they observe the eight precepts to train themselves to practice morality, simplicity and humility.

Statues of the Buddha are decorated and in China bathed in scented water. During their visits to temples and monasteries people listen to talks given by monks who will recite verses uttered by the Buddha twenty-five centuries ago, to invoke peace and happiness for the government and the people.

Light has an important part to play in the Vesak celebrations. Many lamps are lit and there are often spectacular firework displays. Vesak is also celebrated with great joy and vivid colours. With homes being thoroughly cleaned and decorated in preparation.

The Buddhist religious calendar is based on the phases of the moon, as Buddhists believe that the Buddha was born and died at a full moon and most festivals take place when the moon is full. There is no fixed day for worship within Buddhism, many Buddhists attend the temple for puja, (the act of showing reverence to a god, a spirit or other), on days with a full or new moon. Buddhists are reminded to live in harmony with people of other faiths and to respect the beliefs of other people as the Buddha taught.


In Thailand this festival is called *Visakha* and in Japan, *Hana Matsuri*.
