# Welcome to the July Edition of LINK



As I write these words in a blazing June heatwave, I find myself making the same reflection I have done for several years now: it really is getting hotter. All my life climate change has been proposed by scientists as a force we need to reckon with, whilst others pooh-poo it. But now the fact of climate change has become the stuff of lived experience.

There is a serious matter of social justice here, because what we experience as perhaps unusually pleasant, or perhaps distinctly uncomfortable, many communities around the world are experiencing instead terrible adverse weather events that flood towns and destroy crops and infrastructure. Invariably the communities worst affected by these things were already some of the poorest and most vulnerable to begin with.

We need look no further than the great commandment, to *'love our neighbour as ourselves'* (Matt 22:39), to find a motivation why Christians should act to minimise the effects of climate change - because our neighbours around the world are suffering. Our challenge is that we can't see those neighbours with the naked eye, and it's easy to live as if they don't exist. But they do. So let's use the glorious sunshine of recent weeks to remind us to ask ourselves how we can adapt our lifestyles to consume less and discard less, not just as an act of care for the environment, but out of love for our global neighbours in need.


## Open the Book - Tiptoe School

## Take your kids to church...

Make the effort. Wake them up early. Endure the sleepy, grumpy faces and the misplaced shoes. Run around like a mad (thing) gathering everybody's everything and trying to get out the door on time. Hop to the car with a shoe in each hand. If it's raining, get wet. If it's cold, get a jacket. If you're tired, go tired. But take them to church. You know why?



Because Jesus is there ... and He'll meet them there. And you too. He'll be there in the smile of their Sunday School teacher. He'll be there in the hug from a friend and the encouraging smile that assures you that they "just barely made it" too. He'll be there in the worship.

So take them. Carry their Bibles and drawing and toilet roll creations. Sit by them in worship. Open your Bible and open theirs. Show them how to worship. Explain to them why He's worthy of worship. # Ukraine



**Recent Bible Society material** - *'The name Ukraine is thought to come from the Slavic word 'ukraina' which means 'borderland' and Ukraine has for centuries been seen as a frontier between East and West. It gained independence from the Soviet Union in 1991.*

*The Country is strongly Christian. A survey held in 2018 revealed that more than 71% of the population identified as Christians. When the war started, Psalm 31 became 'the key Scripture for all Ukrainians' according to our colleagues in Ukraine. People would recite the psalm wherever they were at a pre-arranged time. It gave them hope.*

**Recently, Ella Perseedos, Director Ukraine Christian Ministries, joined the Cosby's Home Group via Zoom to talk on the work of UCM,** which seeks to plant and support new churches, train and equip pastors and generally bring the love of Christ to these communities. The war is forcing many people to leave their homes and relocate back to central Ukraine where these church groups can provide support.

Youth ministry is provided through Summer Camps run by Ukrainians with UCM's financial support. Ella emphasised the need to support special needs children as there is little Governmental medical or financial support available.

UCM are involved in taking aid to the conflict zone. Their own fleet of vehicles, filled with medicines, food, clothes, baby equipment and much else, are being driven into the war zones, often bringing refugees back from the front line. Ella spoke about a case that involved transferring residents from a residential home on stretchers to a safe area. An example of the ingenuity of UCM teams on the ground is mobile fuel stations. These involve, at great danger to the drivers, vans delivering fuel to people trying to flee the fighting. Ella also spoke about the way UCM and the established church are working together to meet the needs of the people they serve.

**The Big Plastic Count** results were depressing. There is still far too much plastic in a food shop which isn't recycled!

We asked Sir Desmond Swayne, on his recent visit, for better local recycling. His government is bringing forward legislation to put pressure on local Councils, like NFDC, that are underperforming. He has agreed to ask for a deposit return scheme for glass and plastic bottles.

Since the beginning of Lent, we have recycled hard plastic at church. It's too big a job for us to continue on this scale. So, from the end of June we will stop collecting hard plastic at church. However, if each of us **invites our neighbours to take turns with us** to drive clean hard plastic to Sainsbury in Christchurch, we can continue to make a difference. Let's ask if they would like to join our recycling project....
