

3 Hallowed be your Name (Matthew 6:9)

How many names are on your birth certificate? Which one is **really** you?

When others hear it, what image springs to mind? I hope a good one!

In the Bible the “name” is the container of everything that is the essential nature or character of a person, therefore the name of God is more than just a word from a birth certificate. If I am asked to trust a stranger called “Fred” (apologies to all Freds), can I do it, as I know no more than that he is called Fred, yet the Psalmist can say *“Those who know your name trust in you, for you, LORD, have never forsaken those who seek you.” (Ps 9.10)*. Such trust requires more than a word on a piece of paper. To trust someone means that you can rely on them and feel safe.

In praying *“Hallowed be your **Name**”*, we acknowledge that it contains everything that is God; nature, character and personality as revealed in Jesus. (Matthew 11.27-28). Simply, we worship and praise Him for being himself. We give him the honour, respect and admiration for who he is and what he has done. Therefore our prayers should begin with outward worship of Our Father. John Calvin (16thC theologian) wrote “God should have his own honour so that men should never think or speak of him without the greatest veneration” expressed in every moment of our life.

“Make your light shine, so others will see the good you do and will praise your Father in heaven.” (Matt 5.16 Contemporary English Version) - that is the challenge and test of commitment for every Christian if he or she would pray **“Hallowed be your Name”**.

It could be we're tired of hearing about COP26 – but it really is important we grasp what it's all about.



What is COP26?

COP stands for Conference of the Parties and is the 26th such event since the first in 1994 after the UN convened an Earth Summit on climate change. Different countries have hosted COPs. This year, it's on the banks of the Clyde in Glasgow and will be the biggest. Since the first COP, climate change has gone from a fringe issue to **a global emergency**.

What happens at COP26?

For 12 days (Nov 1st-12th), more than 190 world leaders engage in intense discussions to agree new commitments to cut carbon emissions to bring global warming down to 1.5 degrees by 2030 (in just 8 years). With each country having a voice, this process is **huge!** Smaller countries magnify their influence by grouping together e.g. 46 of the least developed (poorest) countries form the LDC group.

Why is COP26 important?

Just a fraction of a degree of warming results in 1000s more lives lost and livelihoods devastated by drought, floods, storms, heatwaves, wildfires ... Commitments laid down 6 years ago at COP15, known as the Paris Agreement, come nowhere close to limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees. The window for achieving this is closing. In the next 8 years, countries must go **much** further to keep the hope of achieving this alive – and thus be on track to reach **net zero emissions** (carbon given out is less than carbon absorbed) by 2050.

The end of COP26 will mark the beginning of years of commitment to honour the promises made. **If a climate catastrophe is to be avoided, each one of us must think about, and make, changes to the way we live.**

If only we had obeyed our Creator God from the start and cared for His Creation as He asked us to (Genesis 2v15). It is CRUCIAL we pray ...

HOW TO PRAY FOR COP26 – using *Psalms 36 v 5-7*

Lord, your awesome power, **UNENDING LOVE** and **FAITHFULNESS** are clear to see in soaring **MOUNTAINS**, starlit **SKIES** and the **DEEP OCEANS**.

You created us in your image, but we have shown ourselves unfaithful stewards of the world's finite resources: greedy for profit and blind to the injustice to victims of Climate Change.

FORGIVE US LORD for failing to care.

We are powerless to meet the challenges of COP26 without you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on all who meet in Glasgow.

Soften hard hearts to act with your **JUSTICE AND LOVE**.

HELP wealthy nations to support the developing world;

governments to act decisively to fulfil their promises;

businesses to develop sustainable technology;

and communities to work together to restore precious habitats.

Help us individually to live more lightly.

Give us courage and determination so that all your creatures

may **FIND PROTECTION IN THE**

SHADOW OF YOUR WINGS.

Carolyn and Bill moved to Evesham in October. Whilst respecting their wish to leave with 'no fuss', we couldn't just let them go without thanking them for all that they mean to us! Carolyn came to us as a teacher at Fernhill, trained for her Readership, then felt the call to Ordination. She was a valued member of the team, with a very real spirituality and pastoral care, spending quality time listening to people, visiting church members and parishioners.


I arrived at Hordle without any computer skills or even a computer and Carolyn patiently taught me the basics (I even wrote a song about it which we sang at several concerts) ... I am

sorry to say that I have not advanced much since! I remember them both with much affection and wish them well at Evesham.

Carolyn is so very caring, thoughtful, sincere and supportive. In discussion, her quiet responses contained an underlying determination which made her thoughts worth grasping. Those who listened carefully to her sermons will have discovered challenges that others may have missed, stemming from her love of the gospel and her Saviour. The parishes of Hordle and Tiptoe, and indeed Highclere, have much for which to thank God.

I remember asking Carolyn to come and meet with me so we could address her statement that she "wanted to be of use in her retirement." One of my least favourite things is creating rotas, so I asked if she would like to create the rotas for bible readers and intercessors. Thankfully, she said "Yes" and I didn't have to think about it again for the next 4-5 years! That was just the beginning of the blessings with Carolyn on board. I'd call the Petts the "quiet and reliable workers" whether it was grass-cutting, keeping up with pastoral concerns, or hovering waiting to say "Yes" to any request made by me or other staff. They will be greatly missed in the parish.

I feel privileged to have had Carolyn and Bill sharing with me since my arrival at St Andrew's. Both have been a great support and have done an enormous amount for the church which has been unseen. Carolyn's discretion and deep understanding of people have been invaluable in enabling me to become part of this community at such a difficult time. Carolyn's quiet spirituality underpinned all her contributions at church and continue to be evident in her magazine articles.



Churches locally have benefitted from Bill's singing skills and enthusiasm in their choirs, giving good foundation in the Bass ranks - initially at Hordle, then supporting the churches around Highclere and, upon returning to the New Forest, Tiptoe, and at Boldre for Evensong, weddings and festivals. On these occasions, Bill was accompanied by his unique plastic "fluids" bottle - presumably with a fresh supply of H₂O, though to date this has never been confirmed ... nor denied! Outside of church circles, Bill has enlightened visitors to Highclere House and, latterly, Beaulieu as a tourist guide and knowledgeable educator. His abilities as a woodturner have produced some fine pieces of craftsmanship.

Bill's contribution has shown a good example of the value of a Christian partner when it comes to the fulfilling of the vocation to which Carolyn was called after she retired from teaching.

When a new lawn mower was purchased for St Andrew's, Bill turned up suitably attired for cutting the grass in the church grounds. We often saw him on his knees in our driveway with the mower, on its side, receiving immaculate cleaning after each job was done!

Bill's recent contribution of music for our entry and exit at church services has been such a boost after so long without music.

While I am sorry to see Carolyn and Bill leave, I'm aware of the wisdom of their decision to move now to be closer to their family. I wish them many happy years in their new home and community, and every blessing in their new environment.

It is a uninspiring afternoon, wet but warm for October, but when I turn my laptop on up comes a picture of a bluebell wood! What a lovely sight.



I have since found more; when I put out the wallflowers, there were conkers dug in the soil. I have cleared out a bin where I put all the leaves which I collect in the garden, and, yes, more conkers. I have seen him busy several mornings since - I shall be looking for new horse chestnut trees next spring! I have spoken to other people who are having the same experience.

The rotted leaves were very good and now cover the ground around the few azaleas I have, and another small bed. Now I have somewhere to put this year's leaves together with a bit a grass, especially if the mower has picked up leaves as well. I have bought a new mower this year, battery driven, and it hoovers up the leaves very well!

I have been trying to tidy the garden up, so that we can bring home some manure to mulch the vegetable patch. I tend to leave the rubbish in piles and my long suffering daughter collects it and takes it away. All the green bits, I just pile up and let it rot down. Another daughter planted some garlic for me and I see it is sprouting. Liz grows it in the Lake District, so it must grow here, but it does like a long growing time - it should be ready to harvest next summer!
