## Churchwarden Duncan Argyle offers these thoughts ...



Some words and phrases have dominated our collective vocabularies across the last 18 months: “lockdown”, “face mask”, “social distancing”, “zoom”. I wonder if we have made full use of my favourite phrase, “Thank you”.

I am reminded of a story entitled “Whose Job?” about four people named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody and Nobody. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was sure that Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it but Nobody did it. Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody’s job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it, but Nobody realised that Everybody wouldn’t do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what Anybody could have done!

I’m very grateful that our parish does not run like that. A huge “Thank you” is due to the many people who helped in the selection process for a new vicar, whether by constructing the parish profile and advertisement, producing or serving food, moving furniture, providing a car tour of the local area. Across the Covid era and the interregnum, many have stepped up their giving of money, time, expertise and companionship for which we are mightily thankful.

## Anne's 'Thoughts from the Tiptoe Triangle'



By the time you read this, we will have celebrated our Harvest Thanksgiving, when we give thanks for God's creation and the good gifts which enable us to survive, and we share these blessings with others, mainly through giving to our local Basics Bank and to TearFund, and as we live out Jesus' command to love our neighbours as ourselves.

As we move towards winter, tradition is that our harvest will see us through the shorter days until the new growth of vegetation in spring, building up towards another harvest later in the year. Indeed, in some remote places, fresh green vegetables are few and far between during the winter months and meals are based on root vegetables. I know someone who spent a winter on the Isle of Iona, and the meals were based on dried beans, such as lentils, and root vegetables, throughout that season. Many supermarket vegetables are imported over this season, with the added cost of transport and the use of emissions in airline flights, and we can become complacent to this by having continued fresh vegetables throughout the year.

God is our sustainer and provider. Maybe this year, over the coming months, we could look at how we can enjoy his blessings and gifts in a new way, supporting local producers and suppliers.

Taking this one step further, we can enjoy the blessings of the shorter days, renewing our energy, and seeing the beauty of the autumn colours, the freshness of the winter frosts, and the opportunity to thank God for his faithfulness as he holds us and renews us spiritually every day, just as he renews the earth each spring.

## 2. Our Father (Matthew 6:9)

What a privilege! St Paul tells the believers in Rome they can use *“Abba, Father”* (Rom 8:15) - the simple word for Daddy.

God is the loving parent so our use of the words does not link us to some far off, uncaring and distant being. Jesus lays down once and for all that the relationship between God and man is that of father and child. God is not to be thought of as an Oriental despot before whom we grovel as slaves.

Men and women, however much they fail in other respects, nearly always try to do the best they can for their children. Unfortunately, cruel parents are to be found, as paragraphs in the newspapers sadly relate. However, the vast majority, whether as a couple or single, try their best when dealing with their children. Jesus remarked, *“If you, who are so full of evil, nevertheless do your best for your children, how much more so will God, who is altogether good, do for you”*, and so Jesus begins his Prayer by establishing the character of God as that of the perfect Father dealing with His children.

It is important to note that it is **“Our Father”**, not *“My Father”*, to remind us that together we share the bond of humanity as the children of one Father, and that *“There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.”*

**Every time we pray “Our Father”, we can know for certain no one is lost in the crowd; we matter to our Father even though he is in heaven.** Although beyond us, He is near *“For in him we live and move and have our being”*. (Acts 17.27-28 )

## August 29<sup>th</sup>, a very different Sunday!





## Thoughts from my Garden ...

My routine has had to change in the last few weeks, as the NHS have given me a new ankle. I am beginning to walk again but gardening is on hold, so my daughter had begun the Autumn prune and tidy up. I have been able to do a little in the greenhouse as I can sit, but there is preserving to do. The pears are ready, so they are peeled and in the freezer, blackberries have been picked and frozen. The plum crop was a failure this year - the branch which fell off took most of the crop with it! We have been thinking the plum tree was not looking good, but it keeps going and must be over 60 years old.


The sweetcorn has been very good; to be able to eat it within minutes of picking it is so good. I think I have picked nearly 4lb of blueberries - the birds did not get any!

Quite a few peacock and red admiral butterflies have been enjoying the fallen pears. There have been so many cabbage white butterflies - we have been clearing the caterpillars, on a daily basis, from the winter greens. They leave the chard alone, preferring the purple sprouting.

I have been reading a lot ... do you remember Phil Drabble? He left his job in industry, bought a cottage with 90 acres, to write, be on radio and television, talking about the wildlife he saw. He mentioned how one of his dogs knew when he was nearly home before his wife heard the car. This triggered my memory: when we were children, we had a dog who would react when our mother was nearly home, disregarding any other cars that might be about.

I must get some pansies soon to put in the pots to give a bit of colour through this winter. The swallows have already left, but the starlings have made a group of about 50, a small murmuration!

Thank you God for the changing seasons.

## Give thanks!

His own experiences in the 17<sup>th</sup> century inspired Martin Rinkart, pastor and hymn writer, to write the hymn “**Now thank we all our God**”. The town of Eilenburg in Saxony suffered severely in the Thirty Years War. The Austrians devastated it once and the Swedes twice. Overcrowding caused by the influx of refugees produced The Plague, which ravaged the city four times.

The only minister to have survived this scourge, it often fell to Martin Rinkart to take as many as fifty funerals a day, including that of his own wife. Famine left its mark, while nearly 800 of its thousand houses were flattened.

At last the ‘Peace of Westphalia’ was signed and the war ended. The Elector of Saxony ordered Thanksgiving Services to be held in every church, and selected a text for the sermons - Ecc.1:22 *Now bless ye the God of all ... May He grant us joyful hearts, and may peace be in our days for ever.*

This so struck Martin Rinkart that its words gradually shaped themselves into a hymn. Its notes of gladness are intensified when we remember the horrors of war which its author had endured, the close of which it commemorated.

*Now thank we all our God,  
with heart and hands and voices,  
Who wondrous things has done,  
in Whom this world rejoices;  
Who from our mothers' arms  
has blessed us on our way  
With countless gifts of love,  
and still is ours today.*

*O may this bounteous God  
through all our life be near us,  
With ever joyful hearts  
and blessed peace to cheer us;  
And keep us in His grace,  
and guide us when perplexed;  
And free us from all ills,  
in this world and the next!*

*All praise and thanks to God  
the Father now be given;  
The Son and Him Who reigns  
with Them in highest Heaven;  
The one eternal God,  
whom earth and Heaven adore;  
For thus it was, is now,  
and shall be evermore.*

Let's “**be thankful**” for all the mercies we have received.
