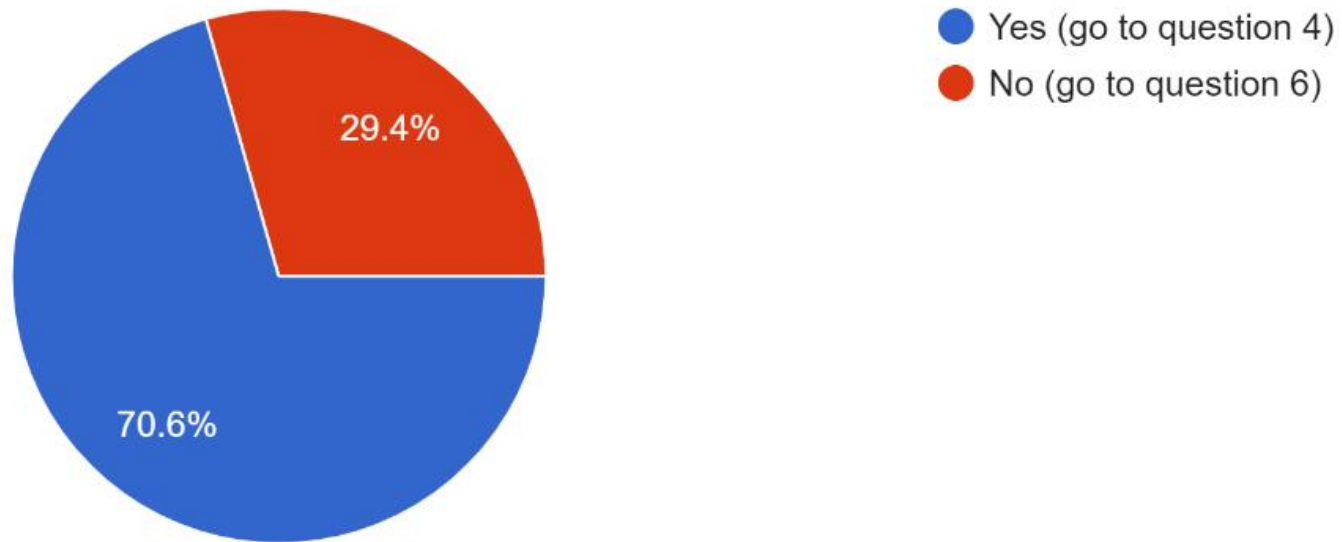


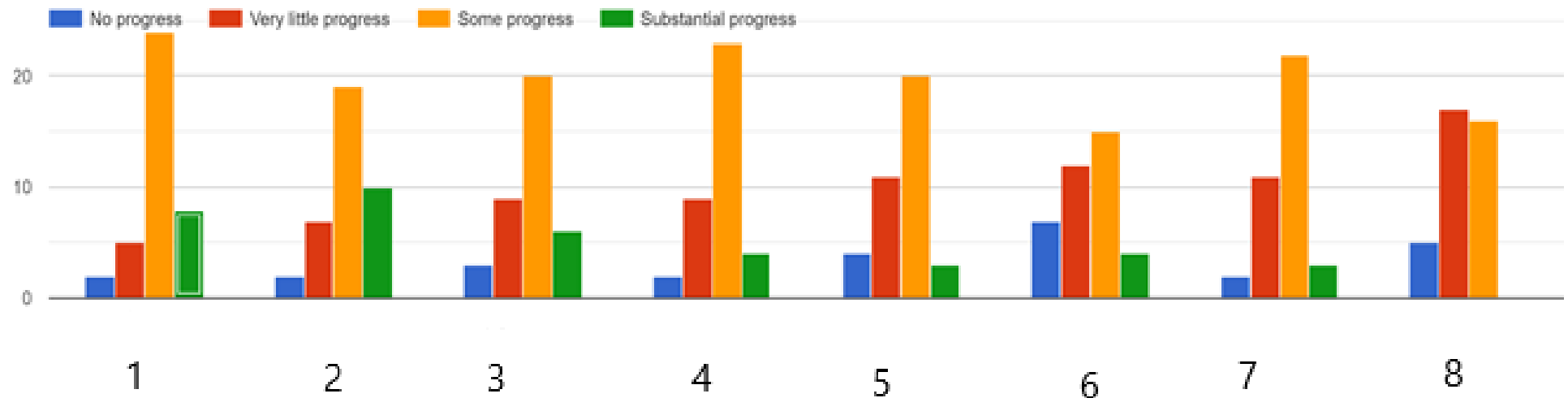

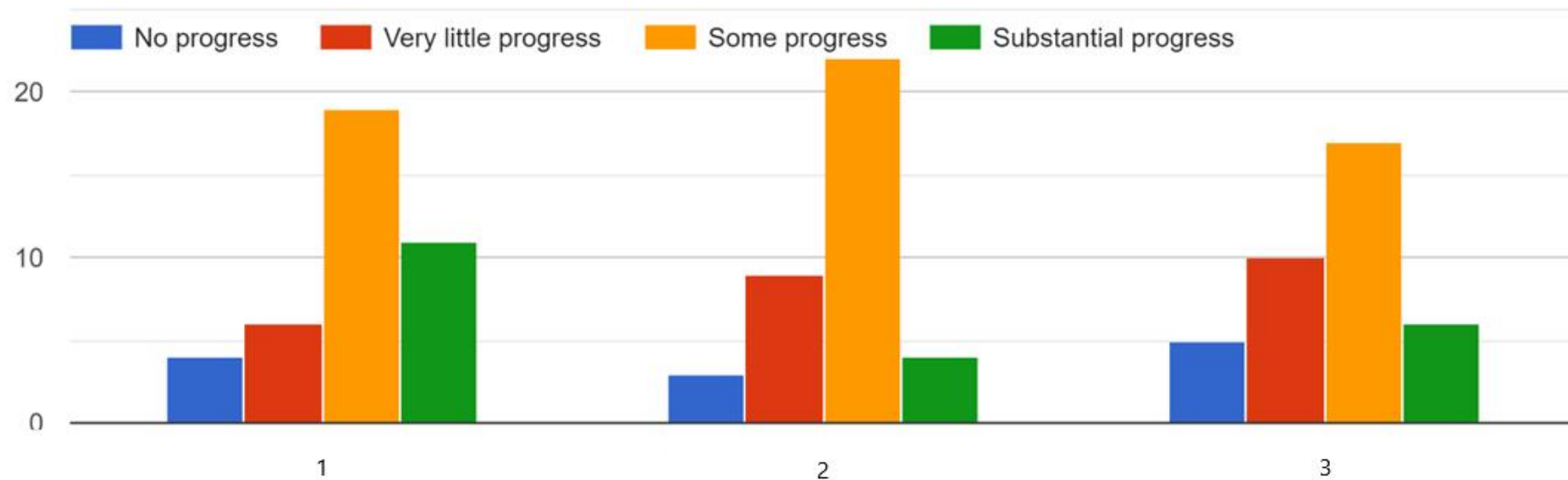
Please indicate the overall progress your diocese you feel has been made in each of these over the last three years.



Key:

1. Articulate, refine and strengthen a diocesan vision for transformative culture change around discipleship in the whole of life.
2. Identify and implement practical actions that have an immediate impact and create momentum.
3. Identify and implement practical actions that deliver long term and deep-rooted change.
4. Undertake activities that move diocesan culture, including ways in which bishops can support and model these changes.
5. Undertake activities with local congregations, to build both the confidence of the laity in their discipleship and greater clergy/lay mutuality.
6. Develop, promote and adopt resources and tools to enable congregations, including children and youth, to assess, review and own their progress towards whole-life discipleship using surveys and 'action/learning' approaches.
7. Structure and plan diocesan communication that integrates and supports both aspects of culture change (faith in the whole of life and lay/clergy mutuality in calling), providing stories and evidence of change.
8. Shape the content and use of leadership training and resources, including MDR, to support the culture change to enable and equip the whole Church.
