

The Last Supper

Possibly one of the most famous paintings in the world. Painted by Leonardo da Vinci (Cenacolo Vinciano) between 1494 and 1498.

The Last Supper is the meal that Jesus shared with his disciples before he was betrayed, arrested and crucified. It is the scriptural basis for The Eucharist. The gospels tell us at the Last Supper, Jesus predicts that one of his disciples will betray him, and that Peter will deny knowing him 3 times. Housed in the Santa Maria della Grazie in Milan.



The Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane

Completed by Andrea Mantegna between 1458 and 1460. It is based on the Biblical episode of Christ's prayer in Gethsemane.

In the Roman Catholic Church, the Agony in the Garden is the first Sorrowful mystery of the rosary and the First Station of the Way of The Cross. In this famous Easter painting you can see Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane after the Last Supper whilst the disciples sleep and Judas leads the mob. Housed in the National Gallery London.

Caravaggio's The Betrayal of Christ

The kiss of Judas, also known as the Betrayal/Taking of Christ, is how Judas identified Jesus to the mob who had come from the chief priests to arrest him. By the Italian Baroque master Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio. Originally commissioned by the Roman nobleman Ciriaco Mattei in 1602, it is housed in the National Gallery of Ireland, Dublin.


