THE TURKISH EARTHQUAKE

Having recently written an article for the Contact magazine regarding my membership of a disaster response team called SARAID and a large earthquake exercise we had planned and taken part in; little did I know that within weeks we would be deploying for real.

On Monday 6th February 2023 at 04.17am local time (01.17am GMT) a magnitude M7.8 (Richter Scale) struck southern and central Türkiye and northern Syria. The epi-center was 37km west-northwest of Gaziantep. The earthquake had a maximum Mercalli intensity of XI (Extreme) with a depth of 10km and lasted 80 seconds. An aftershock measuring M6.7 occurred about 11 minutes after the first shock.

The first I was aware of this was around 2am, when I was awoken from a deep sleep by my wife saying "Your phone's going off" when I checked it was a Red Warning Alert SMS message from the United Nations Global Disaster Alert and Coordination System (GDACS), this was quickly followed by a number of other SMS and WhatsApp messages from other team members. I did a quick check of the UN's VO which is a real time online coordination platform that allows for information exchange early in an emergency and also on social media and neither showed much information about the incident, so I made sure that we were shown as monitoring the incident on VO and went back to sleep. At around 5am I was awoken by more SMS messages coming through on my mobile detailing more information about the quake. It turned out this was the largest earthquake in Türkiye since the 1939 Erzincan earthquake of the same magnitude and it was felt as far as Egypt, Israel, Palestine, Lebanon, Cyprus and the Black Sea coast of Turkey. SARAID's activation procedure now began to kick in and following a second M7.7 earthquake at 1.24pm local time (10.24am GMT) which was centred 95km north-northeast from the first, the Turkish Government request international assistance.

A team of 19 of SARAID's volunteers were available and the rest of Monday was spent by the team preparing kit and trying to book flights, which was being made more difficult due to Istanbul airport being temporarily closed due to bad weather, and the number of Turkish nationals in the UK trying to get back home. Eventually thanks to the efforts of Pegasus Airlines flights were arranged out of Stansted Airport on Tuesday 7th February, but the team had to split onto 2 separate flights which would take us initially to Istanbul and then on to Adana airport. On arrival at Adana Airport the team were briefed by members of AFAD the Turkish governmental disaster management agency operating under the Turkish Ministry of Interior and it became apparent how vast the areas of destruction were. The 9

affected regions were Adiyaman, Kahramanmaras, Malatya, Gaziantep, Hatay, Iskenderun, Nurdagui, Besni and Kirkhan.

SARAID was tasked to Kahramanmaras which would normally be a 3-hour drive from the airport across the mountain but due to the damage caused to the road network it was estimated it could take up to 12 hours to drive and also there was a shortage of suitable transport due to the number of international search and rescue teams arriving. Once again, we had to split the team with the majority loading themselves and most of the kit into a small coach and truck. Two members of the team from our Coordination Support Cell were tasked to remain at Adana airport and assist the local authorities in the USAR reception centre with the facilitation of arriving international rescue teams. After a short wait for further vehicles at the airport, I managed to have a chat with the Turkish military liaison who agreed that myself and the other three members of the team, along with a small team from Estonia could be transported to Kahramanmaras on a military black hawk helicopter.

The city of Kahramanmaras had a population of around 390,000 and the vast majority of its buildings had been either completely or partially destroyed by the earthquake. The base of operations for international rescue teams had been set up on a sport playing field just outside the city. Our initial tasking was to assist in the coordination of the international teams working under the UN umbrella. However, within moments of arriving in Kahramanmaraş it was apparent that this disaster was on a scale far greater than we had anticipated and we were needed on the ground. On Wednesday evening, we joined our German partner team, @fire Internationaler Deutschland Katastrophenschultz (@fire



International Disaster Response Germany), who had been working for the entire day to reach a family trapped beneath a 12-storey collapsed building. As night fell and the temperature plummeted, we lost contact with the trapped victims and were concerned that time was running out. Supported by enthusiastic local construction workers we dug down in front of the building to create a small tunnel towards the basement wall. From here we were able to drill a small hole through the reinforced concrete wall and insert our search camera to investigate the debris filled void.

This led to the incredible moment where a hand reached out and grabbed the camera, confirming the casualties were still alive. After several hours of breaching a larger hole in the wall and clearing the debris we successfully rescued a 34-year-old mother called Hamza and Serpa her 6-year-old daughter, to a crowd of onlookers chanting "Allahu Akbar", an incredibly emotional moment that will stay with me forever. The high was short lived however as we returned to the hole to attempt to locate the remaining family members. Using our search camera again we carefully progressed further into the debris filled void beneath the collapsed building and eventually located the lifeless body of the woman's young son. This was a crushing blow for the team, the only slight solace being that we could offer the mother some closure as to her son's fate.

The weather was bitterly cold, with overnight temperatures dropping down to -10C. At night the city took on a post-apocalyptic feel, with fires scattered around every street corner. People were struggling to stay warm by burning the remains of what was once their home. The air was heavy with the smell of burning plastic and smoke, a smell which was only punctuated by the frequent scent of the bodies that had yet to be recovered.



The devastation throughout the city was on a scale far greater than anyone in the team had witnessed before in 25 years of deployments. The central area of Kahramanmaras was almost totally destroyed, with nearly every building razed to the ground. Those that were left standing were precariously damaged beyond repair. Over the next few days, we carried out countless searches using our technical equipment and search dogs from the international units. This was a frustrating task, trying to piece together information amidst a chaotic situation, and having to make the tough call to move on when our searches drew a blank, despite the pleas from distraught family members, desperate for any glimmer of hope that their family may have survived. On Friday evening however, one of these searches resulted in a positive indication on our listening equipment, a faint knocking sound deep within the rubble of a collapsed tower block. It was not enough to locate the position of the casualty, but it gave us the hope to continue to search the area. We instructed the local recovery team to continue to carefully excavate the debris to expose more of the slab that we had picked up the signal on. Using an excavator to carefully clear the rubble, we exposed a hole in the slab from which we heard a shout and found a 15-year-old girl, Jkbal, trapped underneath

the slab. Our team's structural engineer had to identify the safest means to carry out the extrication, both in terms of the casualty's safety and that of the team. He said it was one of the most intense yet satisfying engineering problems he had ever dealt with, trying to assess the structural form of what was left of the collapsed building in front of him and translating that into what might be supporting the slab below him, knowing that the safety of both khal and the rescue team was at stake. Any movement of the slab could have crushed khal's legs further or worse the entire slab could have collapsed onto the rescue team and khal

Carefully clearing the rubble with our hands, the team managed to create enough space for one of our smaller team members to crawl under and install a prop to secure the slab. Whilst under the slab. Ikbal grabbed his hand and refused to let go. She was surprisingly lucid considering her situation, having been entombed in the dark for over 110 hours. They chatted about her white cat, Cedric, that was also missing, and she asked us to take care of her Harry Potter books. Her love of reading may well have saved her life with her pile of books preventing the slab from crushing her. The team continued to cut away a window frame and a radiator that was blocking her exit. We were able to provide safe access for the local medical team to give her the urgent care needed before we could free her legs. We were then able to pull her out onto a stretcher then to transport her to hospital. The entire rescue process took a little over 20 hours.

I'm incredibly proud of what our team of volunteers achieved as well as the response of our colleagues from the international search and rescue community. The collaboration between teams from around the world, working together without prejudice, showed humanity at its finest. However, above all, I must commend the untiring tenacity of the highly skilled local search teams and Turkish public who worked around the clock without fear in horrific conditions to reach their loved ones. Throughout the week we were welcomed with open arms by everyone that we encountered and received countless acts of generosity and kindness by those who had lost everything.

Our work is merely the first step to a very long road to recovery for the people affected by this disaster. They will need assistance for many years to come. I would like to say a heartfelt 'thank you' to those who have generously supported SARAID over the last week, your donations have made a genuine impact. SARAID receives no funding from the DEC or the government and relies solely on the donations of our supporters. All our team members are unpaid volunteers. By supporting SARAID you're enabling us to go wherever we are needed and help save lives. Our kit is cleaned, bags are re-packed, and we're back on call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year ready for wherever we may be needed next.

APRIL GARDENING NOTES

A thought for 22 April - Earth Day The Earth is fine It's the people that are in trouble

April can have all 4 seasons in one month. Don't be tempted to plant tender plants outside even if the DIY stores and supermarkets have them - we regularly get odd hard frosts any time up to the end May.

Lawns: Sow seed. Apply a weed and feed if you didn't last month, and you don't want wild flowers in your lawn - don't feed wild flower meadows.

Patios: Remember why you have a patio. Clean off the BBQ, chill the white wine - there will be a few suitable days Rhododendrons, Azaleas etc. in pots: Keep watered with Rainwater. Coffee grounds are acidic, so an occasional mulch of these will help if you don't have access to natures, life giver! Remember the 7 inch rule - in order to soak down to the bottom of a 7 inch pot you would need an inch of rain. water, at least fortnightly - more if we have a prolonged hot spell (you never know)

Evergreen Shrubs: A lot of them have suffered badly with our odd weather - the long very hot and dry summer sent them into winter stressed but generally looking ok. Then we had a mild period with plenty of rain, followed by a couple of very hard frosts, which browned the leaves of a lot of them followed by leaf drop on a major scale. Then drought in January, grey February, ice and snow at the beginning of March. A lot of the evergreens look somewhere between terrible and dead. Don't give up yet, leaf drop is a survival technique; when (if) the weather warms up (I am writing this in early March, so the weather could have done anything by the time you read this) they may fully recover or push out new growth from the base or part way up. Give them until late May before you give up on them

Perennials out in supports while new growth is still short Dahlias: Plant tubers outside Take outlings from potted plants when they are about 4 inches long. Don't forget to label the cuttings – they look broadly similar until they flower Annuals: finish off sowing hardy annuals, half hardies can be sown with protection in pots or trays. On warm days ventilate the greenhouse.

Gladioli: plant 4 – 6 inches (10-15cm) deep continue planting a few every couple of weeks until late June they will flower over a much longer period.

Vegetables: Sow in greenhouse or cold frame without heat: French beans (dwarf or climbing), runner beans, ridge cucumbers, sweet corn. Sow /plant outdoors: broad beans, brocolli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, kale, lettuce (a few),peas, potatoes radishes (a few each week until July) Plant out: Broad beans, cabbages, cauliflowers, leeks, lettuces, onion sets and peas. Harvest: anything that is ready. Remember over-wintered plants such as leeks will run to seed when we get a few warm days together, so it is better to harvest small by early May unless you want to keep some of the seed.

Weeds: Weeds are just wild flowers in the wrong place. If everybody allows just a small patch of wild flowers Mother Nature will be grateful. Hoe any that are unwanted on warm, dry days. I removed the so called grass in front of my hedge in the autumn and planted bluebells and a wild flower seed mix. I will re-sow grass seed towards the end of the month when the wild flowers have germinated and had a chance to get established.

General: The garden is there to enjoy. Stop and relax and admire your handy work occasionally

EAST HARLING & KENNINGHALL MEDICAL PRACTICE NEWSLETTER UPDATE – MARCH 2023

I would like to start the update this month with a thank you to all our patients for their patience whilst the Practice transfers to a new computer system, which went fully operational on Thursday 2nd March. Over the next few weeks our staff will be getting accustomed all aspects to the new system, so your understanding whilst this transition takes place is really appreciated.

The benefits of our new system will include having a single Electronic Health Record for every patient. This shared record is available across all healthcare settings to any staff who need it during a patient's care. This improves patient care by bridging the gaps between services.

Every effort has been made to minimise patient disruption, including a large proportion of our staff working through the weekend of 4th and 5th March on the new computer system. In terms of repeat prescriptions, a couple of reminders this month please: If you are requesting repeat prescriptions via the telephone, please select option 2. The telephone ordering service for repeat prescriptions is open 10:00-13:00 Monday-Friday (excluding Bank Holidays). Also, please allow 5 full working days for the processing of repeat prescriptions. Demand for appointments remains high, reflected in the number of telephone calls received, with 4,294 telephone calls received by the Practice in January and 3,468 in February.

We continually review the resource we have available to meet patient demand and have in February increased the level of staffing in our Dispensary team. We are currently advertising for a GP and Receptionist.

Finally for this month, a reminder for patients driving to our East Harling site, the driveway and paved footpath beyond the line of the car park at the rear of the building belongs to the private residential property. We would be grateful therefore if patients could avoid parking on this drive and pathway and avoid blocking access to this property.

This month, not too many crime books you will probably be pleased to hear. I thought it was time for a change for those who read various books. The books can be found in the Harling book swap, any good bookshop, or on Amazon kindle. I hope this inspires you.

The Jewel Garden: A Story of Despair and Redemption by Sarah Don and Monty Don

As a regular viewer of BBC's Gardeners world, I couldn't wait to start this book to read about how they got to where they have today, with their much loved Jewel Garden. Unlike the previous Gardeners World series, they are lucky enough to live amid this beautiful garden that has taken some time to develop, changing every day. Whilst you would think the book is just like any other gardening book, it is certainly not. Many people have said it is truly inspiring, and I couldn't agree more. I couldn't put it down and had to finish it once started. Their honesty in describing the callous times is incredible. Rarely are authors that honest — a great read.

The Creek: A summer suspense mystery by LJ Ross

I haven't read this author's books before but I wanted an easy read. As someone who doesn't always get a good night's sleep, this sounded right up my street. It is set in Cornwall, a location I know very well; having been brought up in the West Country, how she describes life in Cornwall is lovely and brings back many happy memories. It is a crime novel, but you're never sure who did it until the last few chapters. Perfect, right up my street and suddenly sleep seemed a much lower priority. What better way of spending the early hours, kindle in hand and a compelling book?

Through the Garden Gate by Susan Hill

This one attracted my attention as a lover of Susan Hill crime books. It is described as lyrical prose with Angela Bartlett's lovely paintings. A great combination to increase your knowledge of the garden and to inspire you to plant other things. I thoroughly enjoyed dipping into this book. It has pretty large text, making it perfect for those with impaired sight. Very easy to read with lovely descriptions of plants that are probably in your garden. I particularly enjoyed the Winter Garden chapter with amazing descriptions of gardens during November to March. You can almost feel the chill in the air as you read the chapter—a great read on a chilly day.


