Worthwhile and sometimes vital work on clocks is often deferred due to the lack of funds. This booklet gives options that have proved successful to Smith of Derby Group clients in meeting these costs. The information is provided in good faith and to the best of our knowledge. We cannot guarantee success in seeking funding from any organisation listed, but we trust that the information proves to be useful.

We support the carrying out of regular maintenance, instituting an annual maintenance programme, and recording all works carried out in a logbook. Grant making trusts: how to find the right one

The major source for identifying suitable trusts is the Directory of Grant Making Trusts published by the Charities Aid Foundation.

The Charity Commission website (www.charity.commission.gov.uk) allows you to browse the Register of Charities using criteria such as location and keywords.

Local Authorities

The Local Authority Act 1962 and Planning Act 1990 permit a local authority (County, District or Parish Council) to contribute fully or partially by grant or loan towards installation and repair of a public clock, including autowinding, dial restoration, repair, maintenance and lighting of such a clock, whether provided by them or not. This source of funds has a good success record.

Diocesan Grants

Most dioceses can give modest grants and/or interest free loans for the repair of their churches. Application should be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Board of Finance or the Church Buildings Committee at the diocesan office.

Local Appeal/Sponsorship fund raising

LAUNCHING AN APPEAL: An Appeal Committee should provide a carefully worded letter to go to every household and business in the parish.

SPONSORSHIP: By local companies or individuals. Our work is normally finite, improvement is easily seen and usually on a fixed price basis. This method is particularly suitable for dial restoration and electrification. It is possible to add a sponsor's name or logo to a dial.

FUND RAISING EVENTS: Locally organised events such as coffee mornings, craft fairs, fêtes, garden parties, sponsored sports activities and social events can all make a valuable contribution towards raising funds.

ONLINE CROWDFUNDERS: You can set up online pages with targets to raise funding, allowing donations from your local community, and people all over the world. Some require the target to be hit, whereas others provide all funds.

Major Grant Givers

LOTTERY FUNDS: The English Heritage Joint Grant Scheme has been replaced – there are various grants now available through the Heritage Lottery fund open programmes – Our Heritage, Heritage Grants and Resilient Heritage (www.hlf.org.uk)

Big Lottery Fund

The Fund operates a number of funding programmes including "Investing in Communities", "Awards for All", "Investing in Ideas", "Life Transactions", "Supporting 21st Century Life", "Dynamic Inclusive Communities" and "Breathing Spaces". The focus tends to be on assisting projects which will make a real difference at a local level. The provision of modern facilities may qualify

Heritage Lottery Fund

Administered by the Trustees of the National Heritage Memorial Fund, this is one of the "good causes" funds supported from the proceeds of the National Lottery. It gives grants towards urgent repairs at listed places of worship.



Other Charities, Trusts or Funds

Often of long standing, local organisations sometimes provide for the care of clocks and can be helpful for repairs, maintenance and conservation. In particular there are County Historic Churches Trusts who give grants to places of worship. **This source has a known record for funding** – see list of County Trusts at **the end** of this information sheet.

The Council for the Care of Churches administers funds for the conservation of Church contents including for example, clocks and dials; schemes can include autowinding. Principal contributors to these funds are the Pilgrim Trust and the Esmée Fairbairn Charitable Trust. The CCC Conservation Officer will advise.

Did you know? Churches and other tall structures may still be required as sites for mobile phones telecommunications masts. Yearly incomes are possible to fund church works including Clocks.

The **Manifold Trust** has assisted with work to Clocks.

The **Leche Trust** assists conservation of objects of the Georgian period (1680 – 1830).

Landfill Tax Credit Scheme

Landfill operators can offset up to 20% of their tax obligations as a credit that can be applied to projects which can include the maintenance and repair of Clocks. An information pack is available from Entrust.

Try an approach to local landfill operators first; ask if they would be willing to contribute. Ask your local authority for a list of local contractors.

The Morris Fund

Founded in 1939 following the deaths of Jane and May Morris, the daughters of William and Jane Morris. The Society received their residuary estates 'for the purpose of providing a fund for the protection of ancient buildings'. The Fund has been boosted lately by the generous donations from the Lesley David Trust. Historically, grants are awarded towards the repair of churches and church fittings.

Loan Finance

It may be worth taking out loans to enable work to proceed in one continuous operation, whilst fund-raising is going on. Obviously this will be dependent on the ability of the Parish to cope with the burden of repayment.

Diocesan Loans

Many Diocesan Boards of Finance can offer loans in respect of repairs. Your Diocesan Officer should be able to advise.

ICBS Loans

The Incorporated Church Building Society makes interest-free loans, irrespective of the architectural grading of the building.

Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme

Strictly speaking, this is not a grant so much as a refund by the Treasury of the amount of the VAT charged on repair and maintenance work on listed places of worship
