From the Vicarage

If you've ever watched James Cameron's Titanic you may remember a scene near the end when a priest, hanging on to the sloping deck, quotes the line: "I saw a new heaven and a new earth..." It's a poetic passage, well chosen for a dramatic moment, spoken as the story turns through its final tragedy, toward something more eternal. Did you know those words come from the Bible?

They're from the Book of Revelation: the final and perhaps most mysterious book of the New Testament. For many, Revelation conjures images of apocalyptic chaos. Some regard Revelation as a straightforward prediction of the future. But in truth, it is a symbolic vision of a perfect world, and the passage from which that line comes (Revelation 21:1-6) is one of the most hope-filled in all of Scripture. It speaks of a world renewed, not destroyed. A world where heaven and earth are no longer separate but come together as one. It's not about people floating off into the clouds, but about God making his home among us. "Now the dwelling of God is with people," it says, "and he will live with them."

This is a vision of the future, but it's not escapism. It doesn't tell us to endure this life until things get better in another. Instead, it suggests that this life is hugely valuable: that the world we live in now matters deeply; that the good things in our lives may somehow find their place in the renewed creation. God doesn't plan to scrap the world and start again. He plans to transform it.

That makes a big difference to how we live today. If heaven isn't some far-off, unrelated realm, but a perfect version of what we already know, then our actions here and now are part of that future. Standing up to injustice and discrimination, caring for the environment, comforting and relieving those who suffer — these things aren't futile, but part of a continuum between now and the perfect time to come. They are signs that the Kingdom of God is already starting to blossom.

At the heart of this vision is a promise that speaks to the deepest human longings. "He will wipe every tear from their eyes." There will be no more death, or mourning, or crying, or pain. This isn't fantasy. It's a declaration of divine intent. The world we know is full of grief and brokenness, but God hasn't given up on it, or on us. His plan is to bring healing, not just eventually, but now, and to bring it through us.

"Behold, I am making all things new," says our passage. Not "I will," but "I am." Present tense. In the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, Christians believe the renewal has already begun. And we're invited to join in; to be people of hope, healing and courage, even when the world feels dark. To be people of action, concerned with making this world better: not just waiting for another.

So whether you're someone who comes to church regularly, someone exploring faith, or someone who's simply curious, be assured: the Christian story isn't about escapism. It's about renewal. It's about taking responsibility for the world as it is, and the task of remaking the world in the image of the perfect. No-one pretends that isn't a struggle (and Revelation is full of struggle). It's about a world where love wins, where suffering ends, and where God is truly with us. And it starts not with the end, but today.



Everyone is welcome including adults, who are welcome to attend the 7.45pm session to improve their stroke and stamina.



St Patrick's Church in Bampton are looking for more volunteers to help carry on the Great British tradition of Bell Ringing.

Could this be the perfect activity for you?



Why Learn to Ring? There are many reasons; contribution to church life, companionship, be part of a team and community, pleasure and fun, physical exercise and mental stimulation (burns calories, tones muscles and relieves stress) and probably many other reasons as well. Individuals, couples, sometimes whole families or groups learn to ring together from all walks of life, for all faiths and none (you don't need to be musical, mathematical or strong).

When a ringer has learned how to ring they can visit other ringing towers in the UK - a great activity at university - or any tower with bells (mostly UK) where they will find a warm welcome and immediate friendship. It is never too early or too late to start.

Come along for an initial 'have a go' session. No qualifications necessary. Bell Ringing is fun for young people (10+yrs), adults of all ages and well within the capabilities of most people. Also counts as a DofE 'skill'. If after the initial 'have a go' session you decide bell ringing is for you, teaching sessions can be arranged over several weeks or months (depending on your availability) after which you join the tower band of ringers for Sunday Service ringing, Weekly Band Practice, Civic occasions, Special celebrations, Weddings and so on.

Take Positive Steps to Avoid Trips and Falls

People of all ages fall. However, the consequences of falling for older people can be serious. Falling due to aging is not inevitable, there are simple things we can do to minimize risk.

- · Get regular exercise to improve strength, fitness and balance.
- Have your eyes and hearing checked. Vision and hearing play a vital role in balance and movement.
- Ask your pharmacist or GP for an annual medication review.
 Some medicines or illnesses, such as poorly controlled diabetes, can make you feel faint or dizzy.
- Look after your feet. Painful feet and ill-fitting shoes can affect your balance and increase the risk of falling.
- Make sure you get enough calcium and vitamin D to keep bones strong.
- Check your homes for trip hazards. Some risks are obvious, but often overlooked, such as clutter or poor lighting.

Making small adjustments in your daily life doesn't mean that you have to limit your activities. In fact, it can give you greater freedom and confidence.

If you do have a fall or feel at risk of one, tell your GP

PLAY BRASS IN EDEN

- a project supported by Eden District Council





In the "Brass in Eden" project, Drum and Brass is working with four local bands in Eden: Appleby Town Band, Kirkby Stephen Silver Band, Melody Makers - Tebay and Penrith Town Band as well as music organisations including Bjamba Horns and bands elsewhere in Cumbria to secure the future of brass bands in our community.

With a grant of £8,750.00 from the Eden District Council's Arts and Culture Development Fund the "Play Brass in Eden" team _ Julie Hoggarth, Jenny Bowes and Kath Wignall are touring schools in the area with their hands-on brass taster sessions. In these sessions, young people get to play along with the "band" and find out how they can take up playing.

It's not only young people however, who can get involved in the joys of banding. There are also groups for adult beginners and nearly every band will welcome new players with open arms and a cuppa.

The project organiser Drum and Brass sees brass bands as central to community life. For communities, brass bands mark the seasons with music and are a must-have for e.g. Christmas Carol events and Summer Fetes.

For musicians they represent an affordable and sociable way to learn a musical instrument and they are open to all ages. And despite the many challenges of covid and cuts in music education, bands are thriving. Eden has three established bands, which meet weekly in Penrith, Appleby and Kirby Stephen, while three new brass groups between Tebay and Kirkby Stephen with collectively 30 members show there is real interest in learning.





Morland Parish Council held an Ordinary Meeting on Monday 10th March 2025.

Councillors Steve Wilson, Peter Taylor, Dan Fitton, Phil Hancock, Lesley Robson and Gillian Garratt attended the March meeting, with apologies from Councillor Paul Vines. Westmorland and Furness Councillor Neil McCall was also in attendance.

- At the meeting, progress was discussed on developing an Emergency Plan for Morland Parish, involving stakeholders across the Parish. Potential grant funding is available once a plan is established, to help towards issues such as flood resilience.
- Following a recent tree survey, no urgent work is required for tree safety, but it was agreed to follow up on work to Ash trees suffering from dieback.
- Councillors raised concerns with Westmorland and Furness Councillor Neil McCall regarding recent road closures, including concerns over inappropriate diversions.
- The Council is looking to repair the sluice gate at Morland Beck, and



investigating grant funding opportunities for costs.

Consultation is currently underway on the introduction of a Mayoral authority in Cumbria. This would exist in conjunction with the two current unitary Councils. Consultation is also underway on warding arrangements in Westmorland and



Furness. Proposals will see the current Eden and Lyvennet Vale two-member ward split into two single-member wards, with Morland included in the newly formed Clifton, Crosby & Yanwath ward. 
