June – is this spring or summer – or do we just accept whatever weather we wake up to? We have had to adjust our interests/hobbies/social time accordingly for the last 5 months, but one solid and singular way of coping is to read. That can start with a newspaper, fair enough, because if we watch the news on TV then the topic allows less than 1 minute of information versus a newspaper whether the news is presented in a more detailed way.

I read a lot through the 'spring time' and one book which had an impact was a 'Chronology of Scottish History' and how time is speeding by when we remember events which at the time, were big news. Only careful digging on the internet can elaborate on some of the events as news was not recorded in the same way as it is now, with an instant answer for any question. Some news from the 1960s and if you do remember any of these then you will recognise just how time has flown since:

- 1964 Typhoid resulting from corned beef, broke out in Aberdeen in May and June of '64 with 400 cases being reported.
- 1964 Dr Beeching's report closed many of Scotland's railways, cutting off rural d areas resulting in isolation and inadequate alternative transport. Only now do we see the value in the rail network but is highly unlikely that we will ever see many of these lines reopening.
- 1964 I am sure this was co-incidence when many rail were being closed, but the Forth Road Bridge was opened in 1964 and 2 years later, the Tay Road Bridge opened.
- 1965 Capital punishment was abolished.
- 1966 Major gas discoveries in the North Sea.
- 1968 Dunfermline Athletic won the Scottish Football Association cup for the second time. That made history because it is hardly likely to happen again ...... in the foreseeable future anyway.

Fast forward 2024 - all needed in a major way, with no limit.

- Kindness
- Peace

**Dear Friends** 

I wonder if you were one of the many folks who managed to catch the Northern Lights the other evening. My wife Nicola and I saw a friend post a picture on a WhatsApp group we're on, so we decided to go outside to investigate. As we squinted up at the sky trying to work out if we could see some colours (or if it was just the lights from the local take away), we saw some grey-ish patterns and streaks in the sky and wondered if they were the Northern Lights, but we weren't very sure. However, I had remembered that my brother and his wife had been on a Northern Lights tour in the far northern reaches of Norway and he had said that often the Lights appear as grey streaks at first and the way to see the vibrant colours is to take a photo of them as the camera lens seems to pick up or capture the colours better than our naked eyes. And sure enough, once I started taking photos with my phone the colours appeared. It was just wonderful to see the streaks of blue and purple appearing in the photos and looking up at the shapes in the sky. Quite awe-inspiring. Given that it has taken me 48 years to see them, Nicola and I decided to wake up our elder son so he could see them. While lying on our couch cushions in the garden we explained to James what he was seeing and what his Uncle Euan had said about being able to see them better with the camera.

Which got me to thinking that sometimes need to see our lives and the world around through a different lens to capture the glory and the beauty of a situation. If we spend our whole lives 'doom-scrolling' on social media or watching 24-hour news then we can get the impression that the world is a hopeless place. But there are also so many small acts of goodness going on all around us. One example is the story of Harry Marsh, a Church of Scotland elder from South Lanarkshire who, this Sunday 19th May, will do a 5km sponsored walk to raise money for St Andrew's Hospice where he spent eight weeks in palliative care with a Streptococcal A infection with Necrotising Fasciitis (a bacterial infection) which led to septic shock. Miraculously, with the strength of his faith, support of family and friends and skills of the doctors and nurses, he survived and has chosen to raise money for those who had cared for him. Mr Marsh said:

"There is no way I can repay them for the care and kindness in every aspect of human dignity they showed me... but money helps keep the system going and I want to raise awareness of the wonderful work they do."

Mr Marsh could have easily given up or take his treatment for granted, but the he saw his life, his survival, and the care he received through the lens of gratitude. Closer to home, I am sure you will be aware that Formartine Parish Church is currently in vacancy and in the process of searching for a new minister. This could easily be a time for anxiety but by looking through the

lens of faith in Jesus and knowing that God has a vibrant, exciting, colourful plan for Formartine Parish Church and will hopefully help the congregation and community to use this time to hope and to dream and to really build the foundations together as a new church in anticipation for the person God has called to come and build the church here in Formartine. As Interim Moderator it is my privilege to help guide you through the vacancy and to help keep things ticking over and supporting the developments in the church as we prepare for the new minister.

So, friends, I hope and pray that you can find a lens of hope to look through in whatever situation you find yourself in just now, and remember that Jesus' promise to his followers is "...surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b)



she can buy something special as a memento. Her final words were most encouraging and she wished us every blessing as we move forward.

During Alison's seven years with us it has been a privilege to work alongside her as Session Clerk and I know you all wish her well in her retirement.

Now we are in a vacancy and we are looking towards the time when we can call the minister that God is preparing to accompany us on the next part of our journey as a newly united congregation. A team of folk have drafted the Parish Profile – our 'advertising brochure'. It is positive, upbeat, and comprehensive. We have a great story to tell and I hope it won't be long before we are able to elect the Nominating Committee to consider anyone who feels called to our Parish. We will keep you posted on developments.

During the vacancy, worship arrangements are a work in progress. We are fortunate in having two Readers (lay preachers) who are covering three Sundays a month. Rev Alastair Bruce, our Interim Moderator, will also conduct worship from time to time. I am covering funerals and one Sunday per month.

Our visiting preachers, augmented by our own worship team, alternate between Kirks and we 'live stream' their sermon from one Kirk to the other. The method behind this 'madness' is to maintain worshipping communities in both villages without having two services one after the other every Sunday.

I regret that this method is not reliable and our tech team is investigating ways of fixing the issues. I am sorry that we are not providing the best experience of worship just now but be assured that things are under continual review. If the technical issues cannot be fixed, we will consider our options. Please be patient with us as we navigate a way forward.





## **Tarves Heritage Project**

We have had a very busy start to our 2024 season since we opened in April. Our first visitor was Rob from Attic Antiques who was delighted to receive one of our calendars as a gift. He was amazed to see the variety of our displays from the joiners' tools to Duthies shop items from







Since our last article, we held our pre-Christmas open day, most of us ate and drank too much over Christmas, we celebrated the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Shed getting charitable status, we opened as a Winter Café, in collaboration with the Council, we held a family activity morning for children, we had a visit from the Brownies, we held weekly IT drop in sessions, we held our Spring open day, we acquired a 3D printer and are now developing plans for the future.

Optimum use of our internal workspace is a big issue for us. We have embarked on a re-jig of our main workshop. The first step was to replace the air extraction system to ensure we have as much of a dust free atmosphere as possible. We decided that other changes would give more space, better storage, and give more room between equipment (making it safer). So, we are re-organising the benches, cupboards, and some of the machinery. This is work is well underway and should be complete in the next month.

To increase the total amount of indoor space of we have just applied for planning permission for a new portacabin. Hopefully we will hear the result of the application in the next few weeks. We are now looking for a suitable portacabin! If any knows of one looking for a home – please let us know.

In tandem with the planning process, we are looking at our overall use of the indoor work space – looking at all aspects of what and where we do things. This will ensure that we will make the best use of the portacabin when it arrives. One high priority objective is to create an indoor mechanical work area for refurbishing bikes, motorbikes etc. Currently this work is largely done outside.

We continue to refurbish garden benches, tables and chairs. The restoration of the 1960's pedal car is complete and it looks terrific (photo).

The training programme for CNC router is progressing and the range of items produced is slowly increasing. Attached is a photo of a lovely small table made on the CNC by one of our men for displaying one of his beautiful bonsai trees. We are taking orders for signs, commemorative plaques etc.

The IT training initiative with Aberdeenshire, Community Learning and Development (CLD) is continuing and proving to be very popular. The drop-in sessions are on Thursdays at 1-2.30pm. Two of the Shed members are now embarking on SQA qualifications to further support this activity and to help Shed members increase their computing skills.

We are open for new members to join the Shed (membership is free). Many are of the opinion that men need to be 'good at DIY', using machines etc. to enjoy the Shed – this isn't true. We welcome those who want to socialise, have a chat, play cards, browse the internet, read a

book, as much as we welcome those who want to get stuck into the workshop or garden. We have plenty of projects for men to get involved in, plus the new hobby spaces, new jigsaws, computers and plenty of board games and tea/coffee and biscuits. We'd also welcome those who would like to be involved in the administrative side of the shed (IT, secretarial, financial etc.).

The Shed is there for men who may be feeling low, lonely and/or isolated. This can particularly be the case after bereavement, redundancy, retirement, or family breakups. We offer a safe, friendly environment for men to get back on their feet again.

If you are interested in visiting the Shed, becoming a member we would love to see you – we are open 10am-4pm on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. We also have a website (www.ellonmensshed.org) and a Facebook page (www.facebook.com/ellon.shed) where you can find further information.


