A couple of weeks ago, amidst great excitement, the Beatles released their "final" single entitled "Now and Then". It immediately became the fastest selling vinyl single this century and became a number one hit 60 years after the Beatles produced their first UK chart-topper. That this new song exists at all is amazing. "Now and Then" was written by John Lennon in the late 1970s, and the new release uses his original demo recording. Thanks to the latest technology this has been combined with guitar lines recorded by the late George Harrison in 1994. Then added to that are new parts recorded more recently by Paul McCartney and Ringo Starr. Despite the modern technology it would appear that the Beatles' magic is still there! Like so many of the earlier hits of the Fab Four, "Now and Then" is a love song with its refrain

I know it's true It's all because of you And, if I make it through It's all because of you.

Some have suggested that the words were written by John Lennon as an attempt to repair his broken relationship with Paul McCartney after the Beatles acrimonious split. Whether that is the case or whether Lennon was thinking of another relationship we will never know for sure. However, the words of this new hit, "Now and Then", remind us of the power and impact that true love can have on our lives.

At this time of year, we reflect on the power of another love – God's love for us shown in Jesus Christ. As we hear and tell and sing the Christmas story in the words of the bible, or through nativity plays or in the music of Christmas carols we are reminded that Jesus is God's gift of love to the world. Through the baby of Bethlehem who grows up to be the Christ of Calvary, God in love for the world has woven a way of restoring and renewing a relationship that is as significant for us now as it was for the people then.

One verse of that beautiful Christmas carol, "It came upon the midnight clear", puts it this way

But with the woes of sin and strife
The world has suffered long;
Beneath the angels' hymn have rolled
Two thousand years of wrong;
And warring human-kind hears not
The love-song which they bring;
Oh hush the noise and still the strife
To hear the angels sing.

How I wonder will you be celebrating Christmas this year? Will you take time out to listen for God's love song that is the Christmas story – God with us, helping us to make it through all the changes and chances of life?



As part of our outdoor learning, we had a visit from the Haddo Ranger Laurie Malster where pupils learned about The Grow for Haddo school tree planting project. Pupils learned about Haddo trees and forests and will help to replant an area that was blown over



during storm Arwen. Our pupils planted some saplings which we have adopted for the year and will then be returned to the park once they have grown. Senior pupils (P5-7) will be working towards their Junior Forester Award which will hopefully then lead to the John Muir

Award. I have also secured trees from the Woodland Trust and our pupils will be planting them in our school grounds to create a more sheltered area in the coming years. All pupils will be able to reflect on their learning and what skills they will be developing during this time.

#### Rag Bag Recycling Scheme



#### **Charitable Status Granted**

On 9 November, the Scottish charity regulator OSCR approved the application from Barthol Chapel Community Hub to create and a Two Tier\* **SCIO** (Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation).

\*See what this means below.

Having charitable status is just the beginning, and much work will need to be done to raise funds and engage with and involve a wider group of local people to make the hub a reality. The broad aim is to provide a multi-use space for leisure, social and wellbeing activities. These activities will either be organised by the Hub committee or people can hire the space to run their own sessions or events. An initial survey of people living in the area led to many and various suggestion for the use of the hub and the hope is that the Kirk can remain a place that brings people together for years to come.

**Tier 1 Membership** - Membership costs nothing (other than a bit of time filing in a form). It is open to anyone who supports the purposes of the hub and entitles them to have a say (through general or special meetings) on how the hub is run. It also provides a database of people who can be kept informed of events and activities in hub.

Tier 2 Trustees – Drawn from the membership, is a group of Trustees who are responsible for the governance of the SCIO. At the moment four people have put themselves forward as the initial Trustees, but we hope more people will want to join the Board.



We held the AGM Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October in the Queens Room of the Melvin Hall. It was an opportunity to review the last 12 months and seek ideas for future projects.

2022/23 has been a positive year, with the new operator of the Murly Tuck café. Louise and her team continuing to deliver a great facility for the village and visitors. The funding and completion of the off-road path to Haddo, connecting Little Raxton to Bridge of Thornroan was a significant achievement and the outdoor gym and pétanque court continue to be well maintained.

The Trust are keen to hear from residents and organisations in Tarves about initiatives that they would like to see in and around the village, where the Trust may be able to help with either a small grant, making connections or practical support – get in touch via tdt@tarves.org.uk.

It won't really be possible to make permanent changes to the land, like putting up structures, planting trees, due to the terms and length of the lease, so we are very open to ideas.

#### **Good news from the Melvin Hall**

The Trustees of the Melvin Hall have been advised that their planning application for the installation of an Emergency Generator enabling the hall to be classed as a Resilience Centre, with the installation of solar panels,



air source heating and energy efficient windows forming the initial phases of our desired progress towards Net Zero, was recently approved by Aberdeenshire Council. Our thanks go to Vanessa & Julien of Studio Broon, their guidance ensured planning approval was forthcoming in a timely manner. External funding to assist with installing the generator and window replacement has been secured with work due to commence prior to the end of the year.

Discussions with other agencies continue with the aim of securing significant funding to assist with the costs of wall insulation, the new heating system and a solar panel array with battery storage.




#### **Ellon and District Men's Shed**

The picture framers were asked if they could make a frame to fit a painting – the painting needed a white frame, no glass and to appear 'to float' in the frame.

The Tarves Guild visited the Shed on the 7th September to have a look around and see what we get up to. An enjoyable and successful visit for both the Shed and the Guild. The Shed, alongside the Ellon

Photography Group, had a very good afternoon at the Tarves Showcase event on Sunday 1st October helping to raise awareness of the Shed, we also sold some items and took orders for others.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> November the Shed held one of its regular fund-raising quizzes at Ellon Golf Club. 21 teams had a fun evening raising funds to help support the Shed.

The IT training initiative with Aberdeenshire, Community Learning and Development (CLD) is continuing and proving to be very popular. IT/computer skills are needed for many important basic activities (eg booking NHS appointments, repeat prescriptions, shopping) and that many people struggle to master the skills. The drop-in sessions are on Thursdays at 1-2.30pm.

The pétanque piste is now complete. We will leave the surface to settle down over the winter before we make any tweaks to the surface before we starting using it in the spring.



We are open for new members to join the Shed (membership is free). Many are of the opinion that men need to be 'good at DIY', using machines etc. to enjoy the Shed – this isn't true. We welcome those who want to socialise, have a chat, play cards, browse the internet, read a book, as much as we welcome those who want to get stuck into the workshop or garden. We have plenty of projects for men to get involved in, plus the new hobby spaces, new jigsaws, computers and plenty of board games and tea/coffee and biscuits. We'd also welcome those who would like to be involved in the administrative side of the shed (IT, secretarial, financial etc.).

The Shed is there for men who may be feeling low, lonely and/or isolated. This can particularly be the case after bereavement, redundancy, retirement, or family breakups. We offer a safe, friendly environment for men to get back on their feet again.





Pudsey's Job to Roll the Coin to name a few.










We recently held a Book Fair at our Parent Interview sessions. A huge thank you to all who

## Rag Bag Recycling Scheme








