Advent

Introduction to the season

Advent is a season of expectations and preparation as the Church prepares to celebrate the coming (adventus) of Christ in his incarnation.

The Church also looks ahead to his final advent as judge at the end of time. The readings and liturgies not only direct us towards Christ's birth, they also challenge the modern reluctance to confront the theme of divine judgement.

The commercial pressures in the run up to Christmas can make it hard to sustain a sense of alert watchfulness, but the fundamental Advent prayer remains 'Maranatha'- 'Our Lord, come' (1 Corinthians 16.22)

Advent falls at the darkest time of the year and the natural symbols of darkness and light are powerfully at work throughout Advent and Christmas.

The lighting of candles on an Advent wreath or ring was imported into Britain from Northern Europe in the nineteenth century and is now a common practice

Order of Service

Please stand as ministers, servers and choir process into the church.

OPENING HYMN

In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Please be seated. The presiding minister will begin the service with some words of welcome and any notices are given.

THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Candle is lit.

Each of the five candles on the Advent ring has a different meaning:

Advent 1The PatriarchsAdvent 2The ProphetsAdvent 3John the BaptistAdvent 4The Virgin Mary

The president will say a prayer as the candle is lit to which all reply:

All Amen.

A song may be sung, which can be found on the weekly insert.

THE PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

A voice cries out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord.'

So let us listen, and turn to the Lord in penitence and faith.

All Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault.

We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past, and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

As a petition for God's forgiveness and in thankfulness for what God has done, is doing and will continue to do, the choir will sing:

Christ, have mercy, Christ, have mercy,

Almighty God, who in Jesus Christ has given us a kingdom that cannot be destroyed, forgive us our sins, open our eyes to God's truth, strengthen us to do God's will and give us the joy of his kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Please be seated.

A reading from the bible will follow. At the end of the reading, the reader may say:

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

THE PSALM OR CANTICLE

Please stand.

The Psalm or Canticle will be sung. This can be found on the daily insert.

THE GOSPEL READING

The Gospel will be processed to the centre of the Church. Please remain standing and turn to face the Gospel.

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

This response is used at the end of each prayer.

> Blesséd is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna, Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and

blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All ♪ Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Michael, St Mary Magdalene, and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.
