Located in Bracknell, Easthampstead Parish Church has been a welcoming, community-focused, and faithful Christian presence in the community for over 900 years. We are rooted in our catholic Anglican tradition as a inclusive, collaborative, and mission-driven church. We are a growing church with a regular congregation of about 110 that attends. We have a high number of children attend services.

Music is an important part of our life together as a church. We sing traditional hymns (predominantly from our hymn books Ancient and Modern), and occasionally anthems. Our organ was constructed in 1869 by J W Walker of London. Further details of the Organ are attached.

The successful candidate will be passionate about helping lead Christian music at Easthampstead Parish Church. They must also be able to help develop and implement a music strategy for the future as we would like to see our choir grow in numbers and ability.

- Play the organ and direct the choir on Sunday morning at 9:30am,
- Play the organ and direct the choir at major festivals in the life of the church,

- Once every two months meet with Rector to discuss music,
- Once a year to participate in our wedding open day where you will be asked to play the organ for prospective wedding couples, and
- Time for planning and preparation.

Job Description

The musical director and organist will provide leadership for music at Easthampstead Parish Church. Working within the Christian ethos, you will work to maintain and improve our current musical provision.

Key objectives

- 1.1. Liaise with the Rector to choose music for the weekly 9.30am Parish Eucharist, as well as at any other special services throughout the Church year.
- 1.2. Play the organ and direct the choir at the weekly 9.30am Parish Eucharist, as well as at any other special services throughout the Church year.
- 1.3. Organise rehearsals to ensure all choristers have an opportunity to advance their own capabilities.
- 1.4. Develop and execute strategies to increase number of choristers of all ages.
- 1.5. Train choristers and eventually develop an RSCM 'voice for life' program.
- 1.6. Responsibility for the purchase of music resources.
- 1.7. Organise and oversee maintenance of the organ.
- 1.8. Where absent due to holiday arrange an organist to provide cover for services.

Ethics and professional conduct

- 2.1. Abide by Church of England safeguarding requirements and abide by our safeguarding policy.
- 2.2. To represent the needs and views of vulnerable people to the PCC, Rector, or, where appropriate, to enable them to do this for themselves.
- 2.3. Abide by Easthampstead Parish Church policies and procedures.

- other musical qualifications are desirable.

Leadership:

- Can exercise collaborative and relational leadership,
- Build and nurture those in the choir,
- Maintain a welcoming ethos.

- Be able to bring others with you when change is necessary



Appendix Organ Specifications





A pipe tower of thirty-one pipes of crackle-finished grey metal is supported on a platform extending into the sacristy. There are 13 wooden pipes, on a slight convex curve, above the screen on the Downshire Chapel side.

A two manual keyboard with four and a half octaves from CC to G (56 notes). There is an ivory pull attached to a cord that passes through a hole on the fascia above the keyboard via pulleys to the lid of the wind reservoir.

Stops are arranged in four columns, with two columns on each jamb on either side of the keyboard. The three Couplers, Swell to Pedal, Great to Pedal and Swell to Great are operated by draw stop knobs on the bottom of the left-hand jamb.
