At the heart of Christmas

At the Heart of Christmas is the Church of England's campaign for Advent and Christmas 2021. Inspired by readings from the Gospels of Luke and John read at so many Christmas services, this booklet is an invitation to everyone to explore the good news of God's saving love as revealed in the birth of Jesus. It is also a challenge to each of us to ponder in our hearts, as Mary did, what the extraordinary events of

the first Christmas might mean for us now and in the years ahead.

Starting on Christmas Eve and continuing daily until the Epiphany (6th January), twelve contributors share something that lies close to the heart of Christmas for them, bringing the theme to life through a mixture of personal story, Bible reading, reflection and questions to ponder.







I have been asked recently if Church members can still use the Parish Pass when visiting York Minster. As far as I know, the answer is YES!



“Church members can make a reservation for a specific date and time from the **www.yorkminster.org website** or you may **phone 01904 557275** to make a Parish Pass booking for a specific date. Parts of the Minster have to be closed from time to time for special events and there are restrictions. You will be asked which church you belong to (possibly which Deanery also) and also have proof of your home address with you!”




