Coronation Celebrations at Ringsfield Primary!

Following a week of Coronation themed collective worship, we celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III on Friday 5th May. All the children and staff came to school dressed in red, white and blue ready for an afternoon of coronation themed activities.



We started our celebrations with a special street party style lunch, with lots of Union Jack bunting and long tables set up in the hall. To finish off lunch, Mrs Thompson our school cook baked a delicious chocolate coronation cake!



In the afternoon, the parents were invited in to join the children in a carousel of coronation themed activities. The children and parents in activity one completed a quiz, with a selection of questions about the royal family, the coronation regalia and the gold state coach.

During activity two, the children explore the meaning of a selection of gemstones. They then used this information to design their own crown for King Charles.



Commemorative mugs were the focus for activity three. The children looked at images of commemorative chinaware from the past. They were then asked to design their own mug including a cypher for King Charles III.



The children's Coronation knowledge was then tested during a treasure hunt in activity four. The children were asked to solve clues about the coronation regalia.



We finished our celebration day by singing the Coronation Anthem and the National Anthem to the parents. The children had a super day and were given a special commemorative pin badge to remind them about this very important National event.
