The Reception classes visited Ipswich County Library.


Some of our Year 6 pupils attended an Able Writers Day at Northgate High School.

Six Roma pupils worked with a film maker to share their experiences and culture. They will also be visiting Waldringfield Primary School to talk to pupils there.




Students from Ipswich School performed their annual pantomime for us in the school hall.


30 pupils from Year 3 took part in a special Science event organised by St Mary's Primary in Hadleigh.

On World Book Day the children wore their pyjamas and cosied up to read some high quality texts.




An Art teacher from Stoke High School came to work with our pupils in Year 5. They used mixed media to create some wonderful art work.
