## CONTEXT: THE ENVIRONMENT AND ENGAGEMENT OF THE ANGLICAN CHURCH IN ZAMBIA

- In Zambia there is a deep-rooted concept of an unequal gender relationship in which men are considered to be superior to women.
- The full extent of the consequences of violence against women and children is hardly appreciated.
- It affects not only the direct and immediate victims but also other members of the family, friends and the wider community.

## INTRODUCTION

Zambia has remained a country with a myriad of socioeconomic problems despite efforts made in improving key socioeconomic indicators such as:

- Increased Maternal and Child mortality rates,
- Gender and Gender based Violence
- Low Education enrolment rates
- Poverty.

## INTRO CONT.

These problems require not only government efforts to resolve but all stakeholders including Churches.

The Anglican Church in Zambia through Zambia Anglican Council Outreach Programme (ZACOP) is implementing Early Child Development/ MOMENTS THAT MATTER (ECD/MTM), Gender and Development Programmes. The role of the Church in this aspect, cannot be overemphasized.

## INTRO CONT<sup>9</sup>....

- In partnership with ABM and USPG, ZAC has reached out to more than 57,000 people as direct beneficiaries through various strategies.
- The impact of the Gender Justice Programme resulted in the expansion of the programme to other Dioceses and in particular Eastern and Lusaka Diocese.

Increased assets and self-reliance of 80% GBV survivors in all programme sites by end of 2020

#### Programme Goal:

To contribute to the reduction of women and children's vulnerability and GBV in Luapula Diocese.

#### Result 3:

Improved social networks, basic financial and empowerment health education for 600 adolescent girls in all programme sites by the end of 2020


#### Result 4:

# ZAMBIA ANGLICAN COUNCIL PROGRAMME SITES





## PROGRAMME DELIVERY

- \* ZACOP being an arm of Zambia Anglican Council (ZAC) implements its programmes through the 5 Dioceses of the Anglican Church.
- There are stand alone specific gender programmes and mainstreaming Gender into existing programmes.
- \* At Diocesan level the management of the programmes are led by the Bishops.
- The day to day implementation of the programmes is done by Programme Managers/Coordinators and Field Officers supported by trained community volunteers.

- Increased awareness, access and response to Gender/GBV issues and services among the communities in project sites.
- Improved attitudes and practices towards supporting women involvement in decision making.
- Active involvement of the Church and the community in the fight Against GBV.

 Increased self reliance among the survivors of GBV and women.

 Improved livelihood of people through Savings with Education and other economic activities.

 Strengthened collaboration with key stakeholders (Church, traditional, government and community leaders)

# ENGAGING MEN IN ENDING GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE IN ZAMBIA (BOTH IN CHURCH AND OUTSIDE CHURCH).

#### **ZACOP** has:

- Formed the Men Engage Networks.
- Encouraged 50% participation of both genders in all activities.
- Trained Faith Leaders with 60% Men and 40% women participation.
- Deliberately targeted the male church groups on issues of Gender/GBV.
- Sensitized the church members through sermons and Bible study guides.

# CHALLENGES EXPERIENCED DURING IMPLEMENTATION

## Generally

- The COVID-19 pandemic affected programme activities
- With the era of COVID -19 there has been an increase of gender based violence.
- Early marriages
- Domestic violence
- Child pregnancies
- Sexual violence
- Limited comprehensive support for the girls and boys withdrawn from early marriages to sustain themselves.

## CONT...

#### Church level:

- Inadequate information on management of Gender /GBV cases.
- Inadequate resources to effectively train Faith Leaders on management of GBV cases effectively.

## Community level:

- High expectations among community members.
- Limited/ lack of adequate service provision e.g Police- programme worked with the traditional courts.

#### WAY FORWARD

- ZACOP plans to evaluate the 2018-2021
   Strategic Plan and develop a new 3 years
   Strategic Plan by the of end 2021.
- Review and update the current Gender Policy

 Develop a Policy on Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA)



#### WAY FORWARD CONT...

- Adaptation of Gender strategy
- Roll-out the Faith Leaders Training Manual on Gender in the Church
- Intensify the Radio Programmes to expand reach.
