## Girls Education for Gender Justice

This is a programme that has contributed to improving the living standards of vulnerable households across the four dioceses of the Anglican Church of Malawi.


The programme is holistic and recognises that some issues that affect people are inter-related.

One of the focuses is on girls and young women in a multi-faceted way, starting with their education.

To improve literacy amongst girls, it looks to increase school enrolment. At the same time, it works with community members and the girls' parents to reduce early marriages and early pregnancies, and the rate at which girls drop out of school.

The project will also promote climate justice through girl's education. Educating girls benefits wider society and helps tackle the climate emergency in several ways:

- By empowering girls and helping them learn about their reproductive health and rights
- Supporting pro-environmental decision-making
- Developing girls' green skills



## Food Security and Climate-smart Agriculture

Another focus is to achieve increased household income and food security. The interventions equip farming households with improved farming skills, equipping households with business skills and ensuring that vulnerable households have access to loans.

The programme has established farmers' groups to teach farmers to use new agricultural technologies to their benefit. It also ensures that households, churches and other institutions are knowledgeable about environment management. To achieve this, the programme has run community awareness meetings and campaigns promoting the use of environmentally friendly stoves and the planting of trees.

The programme has insured that it can sustain the initiatives that are put in place in the long-term. This will happen through refresher courses, mentoring and community exchange visits.
